

Maps and block equivalencies for new congressional and legislative districts

On April 30, 2012 the U.S. Department of Justice precleared Florida's newly enacted congressional, state house, and state senate districts. All required legal reviews are complete, and the new districts can be implemented for elections in 2012.

The user manual (<http://maps.flsenate.gov/de1/help>) explains how to use District Explorer's controls to navigate the interactive map, print PDFs, and retrieve demographic information.

To use District Builder as a tool for modeling new precincts, supervisors can sign up for an account at http://www.flsenate.gov/Session/Redistricting/sign_up.cfm, then contact Senate staff for tips.

To facilitate the task of joining new districts with Census blocks in your GIS and elections systems, supervisors can download a "csv" table with block equivalencies for the three new plans (plus benchmark plans and total population for QC checks). Congressional, state senate and state house districts are numbered consecutively in the csv table from 1 to 27, 40, or 120, respectively. The table has a header, 484,481 records, and the following fields:
